Keep that Tile Roof

One of the features of Greendale Originals which makes them unique structures is their tile or slate roofs. Many have lasted 65 years, and they can easily last 500 years if properly maintained. And while that maintenance may seem costly up front, over the long-term it can still compare to a new shingle roof. During the past 65 years, a shingled roof would have needed to be replaced at least twice (figuring a 25-year life span). Your original roof was done once!

Also, maintaining a tiled roof is recommended in the village's guidelines. But wouldn't it be nice if the village would offer a tax break for maintaining an original roof?

One big tip for keeping your roof in good shape is not to let anyone walk on it. The tiles will crack if someone does so be sure that if a contractor goes up there for roof, chimney, or other work that they DO NOT walk directly on the tiles. They need to use roof pads so the tiles are not damaged.

If you decide to replace your tile roof with shingles, please contact GONA president Jeff Birmingham at 423-0963. The good shingles can always be used on another house.

July Meeting Minutes

The meeting was called to order by the president at 7:35 PM.

The meeting minutes of the June 2nd GONA meeting were approved.

The treasurer reported that the balance in the GONA account is \$286.75. This is before deducting printing costs for the July newsletter and the t-shirts.

The secretary recognized those volunteers who delivered newsletters to Greendale originals this month.

Newsletter: Thanks to Jeff Birmingham for the historical article that appeared in the July newsletter. We have received two additional advertisers. We have enough now to put 4 or 5 ads in the newsletter. The newsletter was also delivered to businesses this month. Next issue is Joe Russ' last issue as editor. Bruce Evans has volunteered to be editor starting in September. Occasionally, we have individuals who do not want the newsletter delivered to their home. We will include contact information in the newsletter for those who do not want to receive the newsletter to notify us. The secretary will look into printing the newsletter through the Greendale schools to save on cost. There was a motion to make the August newsletter four pages. It was approved. The August newsletter will include the invitation to the GONA party.

Website: Joe Russ has updated the website. There was a complaint emailed to us about a service provider listed on the Good Experiences List concerning price. We discussed the possibility of getting basic prices from the providers on the list. We may want to form a committee to address this further. There are a number of options including writing to the service provider to notify them of a complaint. Joe will put instructions on the list to call for prices. We noted that some service providers do not want to work on Greendale original homes (e.g., work in the crawl space).

T-shirt sales/Green Market: We have already sold 14 t-shirts at the Green Market. We ordered 50 shirts altogether and are selling the shirts for \$11.00 (\$5.50 profit per shirt). Please contact Jeff Birmingham if you are able to volunteer to sell t-shirts at future Green Markets, 8:00
