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### Crown Moulding for Originals

Last summer we needed to have some roof tiles replaced on our Original townhouse due to possible lightning damage. After having the insurance adjustor look at it and approve the work, the damaged tiles were replaced, a fire and ice shield installed, but then another issue arose - the crown moulding along the roof had also deteriorated (the southern exposure took its toll). So I asked the contractor to get me some good pieces of the old moulding to use for a profile sample. Once armed with that we started scouring various lumber providers. We wanted to duplicate it to keep it original, but without the cost of having special blades made to match. After a couple of weeks we finally visited Bliffert Lumber at 2128 W. Morgan Ave. who came through with a solution. While not quite a 100 percent match, it is very close. The original moulding consisted of four pieces, while the replacement is six. While I'm not sure if all Originals have the same moulding, the list for my moulding is as follows:

- Pond. Pine D-Sel. 1 X 6 X 8 '

Rip to two pieces

1 @ 2 1/2

The other at 1 7/8"

This one with a bevel to 7/16 thick going 5/8" back

- BLF231 Pine Cove --2 3/4" X R/L
- BLF300 Pine Outside Corner-3/4 X 3/4 X R
- BLF70 Pine Base Cap 5/8 X 7/8 X R/L
- BLF210 Smoot Pine - 5/8" Return Bead

Cost for material is about \$5.50 a foot.
