She has also been featured on Garrison Keeler's "Prairie Home Companion" and National Public Radio's "World Café."

Pluer has won many Wisconsin music awards over the years including Milwaukee's Best Female Vocalist for 3 years and 6 WAMI (Wisconsin Area Music Industry) awards.
