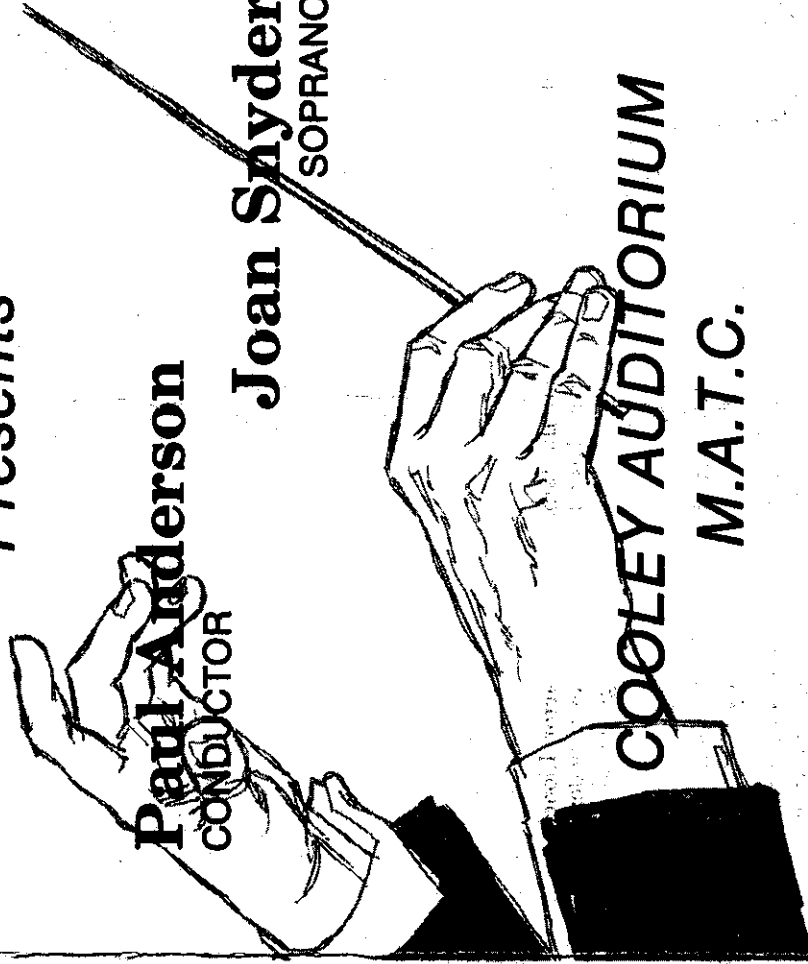

CONCERT OVERTURE

The eminent American composer-conductor Henry Hadley was born and educated in New England. He served as conductor of the Seattle, San Francisco and New York Philharmonic Symphony Orchestras and founded the National Association of American Composers and Conductors. Through this organization he was able to help many fellow composers. The music of Henry Hadley is neither experimental or radical, but is thoroughly traditional and always effective.
